UNFAIR TREATMENT INCIDENT REPORT

Background: "Bullying is repeated verbal, physical, social or psychological behaviour that is harmful and involves the misuse of power by an individual or group towards one or more persons. Cyber bullying refers to bullying through information and communication technologies.

If someone teases or behaves in a mean or aggressive way once, it isn't bullying. It is not okay, but it isn't bullying. A fight or disagreement between friends isn't bullying (antibullying.nsw.gov.au updated 2018)

Bullying can involve humiliation, domination, intimidation, victimisation and all forms of harassment including that based on sex, race, disability or sexuality. Bullying of any form or for any reason can have long-term effects on those involved including bystanders. Teachers rarely see what is going on between students in the playground and often never learn about the bullying that has taken place. If they can influence students to act as positive bystanders bullying and peer victimization will be significantly reduced.

Remember **doing nothing** will **accomplish nothing**. Reporting bullying is **NOT** "dobbing". It's standing up for yourself - the right way.
