### From the Principal

Education week was celebrated at Banora Point High with the introduction of a new learning program for our Supernova class. They produced their first Images of Greatness event and it was a wonderful success. This program is based on the Williams Model for curriculum differentiation. The model provides ideas about how to infuse a program with challenges for gifted students. This model is based on studies of the creative person and process. Students chose a significant figure in history who had been involved in overcoming new challenges. We had a large range of characters from the past including Neil Armstrong and Captain Cook. The students did presentations on stage as well as guestion and answer activities from their information booths. Congratulations to all students involved in this new program and thank you to the staff and parents who supported them so well. A special thanks to Mrs Clurey and Mr Bristow for their leadership of this program.



The P&C meeting has been moved to Tuesday 6th August at 7.00pm. Some key issues that will be discussed include changes to the canteen, uniform and the homework policy. Our P&C continue to be a very active body and are making significant contributions to our school. Come along and be a part of this important part of our school community.

We are currently reviewing our Homework Policy document. New homework guidelines were developed by the DEC in 2012, along with both a Research Scan and a Parent Guide to Homework. The Research Scan summarises research on homework, looks at both the Australian and the international context, by examining more than 50 national and international studies. Strategies are outlined that help to maximise the advantages of homework. It also looks at whether the time spent on homework helps to improve student outcomes. It is important that we have a clear understanding regarding the purpose, nature and volume of homework so that we provide the best support for our students' learning as well as an appropriate lifestyle balance. We are also currently developing a survey tool that will seek opinions from students, parents and staff to help us with the development of our homework policy. Our Trial Higher School Certificate exams commence in week 4 and wish our students every success. Once again I can't emphasise strongly enough that the most important aspects of our exams is proper preparation prior to the exams and effective feedback following them. Students will have little idea about their capabilities if they haven't put the effort in and will be uncertain how to improve if they aren't able or willing to apply post exam feedback.
