### ROAD CLOSURE AND SCHOOL BUS ROUTE

### INNOVATIVE DESIGN CONFERENCE

I have been fortunate during the last two weeks to have attended both the Innovative Design conference and the State Secondary Principal conference. Leaders in education both international and Australian, shared with us the latest research and innovative practice that is being employed in some very successful schools. It was reassuring to see that our approach in many of the areas that were presented appears to be ahead of most schools. We have spent 18 months on developing design teams with specific focus areas from our school plan and they continue to improve the processes that they have designed. We have come away with some very tangible strategies that will help with the refinement of innovations already in the process of being implemented.

### STAFF MEETING FOCUS

Our second extended staff meeting is being held today as an alternative to School Development days at the end of the year. We will focus on the work of the ALAN team (Advancing Literacy and Numeracy), developing plans and strategies to engage our middle school students in new knowledge, using our new third party software (SENTRAL) and reviewing our school plan and monitoring milestones. A large amount of the current initiatives have been made possible through the use of the Resource Allocation Model, linked to Gonski funding. This has also allowed us to make more technology available. One example of this is our increase in data projectors installed in the school. We currently have over 80% of classrooms with data projectors.

### SCHOOL GROWTH FOR 2017

Our projected numbers continue to grow and we have been told recently that if our enrolments are maintained into 2017, another Head Teacher position will be available. The nature of this position will be decided after consultation with the staff and wider school community, and will be a welcome addition to the school.

### SCHOOL HOLIDAYS AND RECOMMENCEMENT DATE

On behalf of the Banora Point High School staff, I wish all members of our school community a safe and enjoyable July vacation. School will recommence for students on Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> July.

### MESSAGE FOR HSC STUDENTS AND PARENTS



**The written HSC examinations will commence on 13 October 2016.**

Students are not permitted to take mobile telephones or other electronic devices into the examination room. Mobile phones may ring, disturbing concentration, and students may be tempted to use mobile phones and devices to cheat.

Schools have developed a process to ensure that students cannot access their mobile phones or other electronic devices when in the HSC examination room.

Our process will be implemented for all formal assessment tasks, so that students become used to the process.

Students who are found with a mobile telephone or electronic device during an HSC examination will have breached the examination rules. Penalties can include loss of examination marks or cancellation of the course.



# YEAR 9 TAKE ON TRIGONOMETRY

Year 9 Mathematics students are currently studying techniques related to finding distances and angles using right angled triangles, this is known as Trigonometry.

## MEASURING A RIVER

Mrs Smith's Class 9S undertook an investigation activity where they had to find the distance across a river (using desks as the river banks), which was too wide for them to measure using traditional measuring instruments.

They learned about using markers on both sides of the river to determine points to measure between, used protractors to find the angle and applied recently learned trigonometry calculations. Students discovered that certain angle measurements were more accurate in calculating the distance than others.

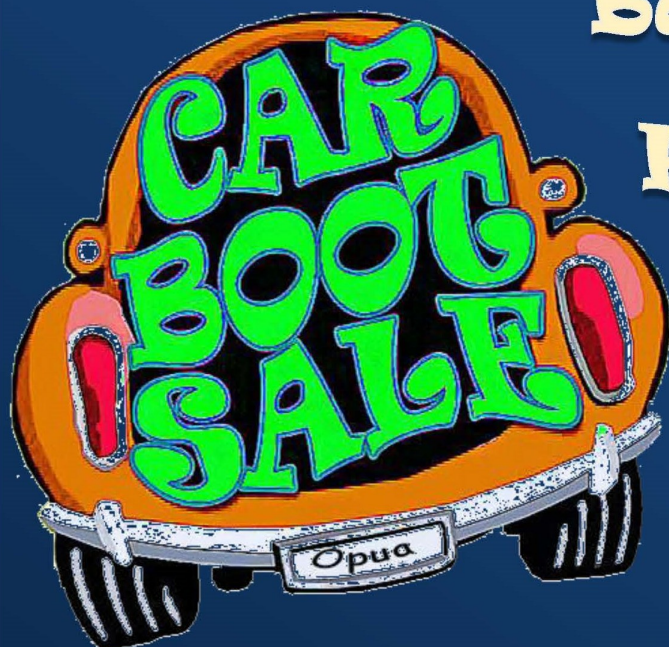

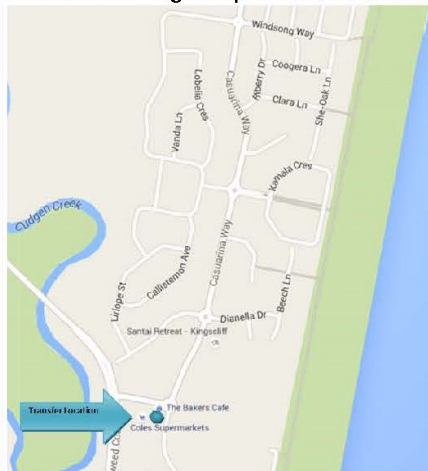

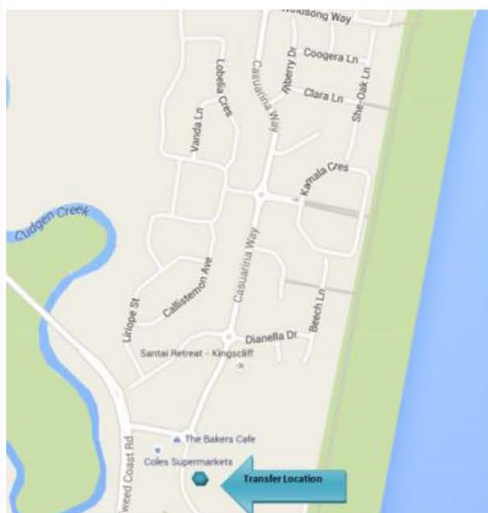

# THE LASTING BENEFITS OF GROWING UP AROUND BOOKS

There are many things one may take issue with in Marie Kondo's mega-best-selling *The Life-Changing Magic of Tidying Up*, but for a certain sort of person, one particular piece of advice she gives is unthinkable: Throw away your books, she says. Get rid of as many as you possibly can, both the ones you've read and the ones you haven't (and know you never will). For your very favorites, she allows, you may rip out the best parts and keep only those pages.

This is impossible advice to follow for bookworms, whose preferred home environments look something like beloved used-book stores. And there is now, Quartz\_reports, a bit of empirical evidence about the lasting benefits of keeping

Stacks of books lying around, at least in childhood — kids who grow up around books end up being more successful. In a study of nine European countries, a team of economists from Italy found that boys who had access to non-school-related books grew up to make 9 percent more, on average, than boys who did not have many non-textbooks around. (Alas, this data set focused only on the guys.)

Writer Thu-Huong Ha breaks down the study methodology:

The researchers based their models on data collected from men between ages 60 and 96 from Austria, Belgium, the Czech Republic, Denmark, France, Germany, Italy, the Netherlands, and Sweden, part of a massive ongoing survey of Europeans. They compared whether the men grew up in rural or urban environments, the years they were in school, roughly how many books they had in their houses at age 10, and their income across their lives.

According to the study, which was published in *The Economic Journal*, the magic number of non-schoolbooks appeared to be ten. "Crucially, there was no significant difference between whether participants reported having 50, 100, or 200 books growing up," Ha explains. "The key was whether they grew up with any number of books greater than ten."

This study captured data from in the pre-internet era, so it's not clear what this may mean for children growing up today. And it's true that it may not be the books themselves that created this association, or not exactly, anyway. A house with books is likely a house that values education; it may also be a signal of higher socioeconomic status.

But in recent years, psychological science has found that reading fiction increases empathy; one 2014 study on the *Harry Potter* series in particular found that kids who read about magic and Muggles were more likely to have positive feelings about people who were different from them. Perhaps the emotional intelligence that kids gain from reading helps set them up for success later in life. In sum: Books are great! Keep 'em around.

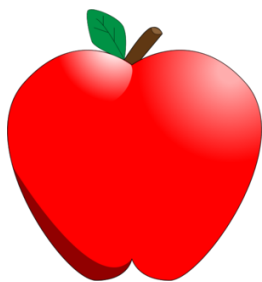
